Community Foundation Scholarship Program For 2012

Since 1949, the Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley has awarded more than \$8.8 million in scholarships.

The Community Foundation Scholarship Program consists of separate scholarship funds created by individual donors who establish the criteria for the administration of their scholarships. Such criteria must be consistent with overall Community Foundation policy.

General Policies

- The Community Foundation Scholarship Program begins the week of November 21, 2011. The deadline date for submission of a completed application form is January 15, 2012.
- Only one application form is required from any one student to be considered for all scholarships offered through the Community Foundation Scholarship Program. Students who submit an application will be applying to the Community Foundation Scholarship Program as a whole, not for a particular scholarship, and will be considered for all scholarships in which they are eligible.

Please Note: Although an applicant may be eligible for several different scholarships offered, **only one scholarship will be awarded to any one student in any given year.** This policy is in keeping with the philosophy of the Community Foundation Scholarship Program to help as many individual students as possible.

- Students eligible to renew a scholarship received from the Community Foundation in a previous year for use during the 2012-2013 academic year will not be considered for an additional scholarship through the 2012 Community Foundation Scholarship Program.
- Most high school senior applicants will be interviewed (in person or by telephone) by members of the Community Foundation Scholarship Committee during February, March or April of 2012. Eligible applicants will receive prior notification.
- Students who submit all required application materials will receive an email notification of the Scholarship Committee's recommendations in May 2012.
- The monetary value of each scholarship award will vary depending upon the available income in each individual scholarship fund.
- Scholarship awards are designated as one-time awards or renewable awards depending upon the scholarship fund criteria, as established by the donor of the scholarship fund.
- The Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley reserves the right to amend or to modify the scope of the Scholarship Program.

Primary Eligibility Requirements

- Eligibility is restricted to students who will attend an accredited institution of higher learning on a full-time basis during the 2012-2013 academic year. Accredited institutions may include a two-year college, four-year college or university, professional/trade/vocational school, or graduate school.
- Eligibility is restricted to permanent residents of the Community Foundation service area unless the scholarship fund criteria designates otherwise.

Scholarship Availability

The following types of scholarships are offered through the Community Foundation Scholarship Program. The majority of scholarships offered are Traditional Scholarships.

- **Traditional Scholarships**

Based on academic ability and financial need. Eligibility is limited to applicants who meet one or more of the following requirements.

- Students who will complete the 2012-2013 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submit the resulting Student Aid Report (SAR).

The FAFSA is a form that may be submitted annually by current and prospective college students (both undergraduate and graduate) in the United States to apply for federal student financial aid (including Pell grants, Stafford loans, PLUS loans, and work-study programs). It is also used to apply for most state and college financial aid. (Submitting a FAFSA does not commit or require a student to accept financial aid offered from the U.S. Department of Education, a state, or a college.) - Students who are currently participating in the National School Lunch Program through a high school.

The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) is a federally assisted meal program operating in public and nonprofit private schools and residential child care institutions. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free lunches to children each school day. Further information is available at: www.fns.usda.gov/cnd/lunch/

- **Merit Scholarships**

Based on academic ability. Financial need is not required. Eligibility is open to all applicants.

Student Classification

The following types of students may obtain an application to apply for a scholarship for the 2012-2013 academic year at www.communityfoundationfrv.org/2012schprogram.asp.

- **High School Seniors**

- Students who will receive their high school diploma from a high school during or at the conclusion of the 2011-2012 academic year and are immediately continuing their education at the beginning of the 2012-2013 academic year.
- Students who will complete their high school education as a home-schooled student during or at the conclusion of the 2011-2012 academic year and are immediately continuing their education at the beginning of the 2012-2013 academic year.

- **Undergraduate Students**

- Students who have completed their high school education prior to the 2011-2012 academic year and are furthering their education at the undergraduate level of study at the beginning of the 2012-2013 academic year.
- Students who have obtained a General Education Development (GED) certificate prior to, during, or at the conclusion of the 2011-2012 academic year and are furthering their education at the undergraduate level of study at the beginning of the 2012-2013 academic year.

- **Graduate Students**

- Students who have attained a bachelor's degree and are undertaking advanced studies at the graduate level at the beginning of the 2012-2013 academic year.

The following chart indicates scholarships available to students by school and education level.

Remember: As stated above in our General Policies, only one application form is required from any one student to be considered for all scholarships offered through the Community Foundation Scholarship Program. Students who submit an application will be applying to the Community Foundation Scholarship Program as a whole, not for a particular scholarship, and will be considered for all scholarships in which they are eligible.

Traditional Scholarships

The following scholarships are based on academic ability and financial need.
Eligibility is limited to students who submit a 2012-2013 SAR or participate in the National School Lunch Program.

No.	Availability	Scholarship Criteria
1.	HS	A+ Foundation Alumni Scholarship of West Aurora High School – Available to students ranking in the top twenty percent of their graduating class. Reserved for graduates of West Aurora High School.
2.	HS	Claude L. Allen Memorial Scholarship – Available to graduates of East Aurora High School.
3.	HS U G	Edward & Gladys (Stoddard) Arenkill Nursing & Medical Education Scholarship – Available to students pursuing undergraduate studies within the fields of nursing, vocational medical training, or healthcare or to students pursuing graduate studies within the field of medicine. For those students pursuing undergraduate studies, preference will be given to students returning to school after a lapse of one or more years since the completion of their high school education.
4.	HS	Armbruster-Dieterich-Wagner Family Scholarship – Available to graduates of East Aurora High School who reside within East Aurora School District 131.
5.	HS U	Aurora Area Retired Teachers' Association Scholarship – Available to students attending a two-year college at the freshman or sophomore level or to students pursuing studies at a professional, trade or vocational school. Reserved for residents of Batavia School District 101, East Aurora School District 131, Geneva School District 304, Kaneland School District 302, West Aurora School District 129, or St. Charles School District 303.
6.
